SUBJECT : INCREASED FREQUENCY OF NETCALLS
CONDUCTED BY THE COMMAND CENTER OF THE
PORT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO


In view of the continuing implementation of the International Ship and Port Facility Security (ISPS) Code and as part of ensuring that the ports' communication system is operational and all security personnel are alert and vigilant at all times especially on situations where the port is placed under *Heightened Alert Status* due to the recent terrorist attacks and the prevailing threats in the region, all Command Center (ComCen) Operators are hereby directed to increase the conduct of random radio network calls (netcalls) participated by the ports' security personnel as well as those private companies required by the Authority to take part on such netcalls as they also have a vital role in the port security monitoring and implementation. Consequently, ComCen Operators shall conduct random netcalls for at least three (3) times during his/her shift or more, as may be directed by the Station Commander or PFSO.

ComCen Operator shall ensure that all posts are responding to every netcall conducted; otherwise, he/she shall immediately notify the Shift-In-Charge guard or the duty Port Police Officer any unresponsive post/s for the latter's verification to such unresponsiveness. If the reason of being unresponsive is due to the security personnel's laxity or inattentiveness, the duty Port Police Officer shall immediately take action and impose appropriate sanction to the erring security personnel.

Further, ComCen Operator shall immediately transmit thru email the netcall reports to the Port Manager, Division Managers and other concerned units for their information and reference.

This Advisory takes effect immediately and shall remain in force, unless sooner ~~revoked~~ or otherwise amended by this Office.
