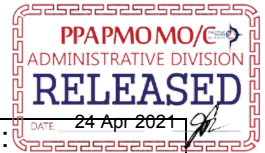

<p>Respectfully disseminating herewith the unnumbered Memorandum from the General Manager of PPA-Head Office dated 11 April 2021 Re: Implementation of MECQ in National Capital Region, Bulacan, Rizal, Laguna, Cavite, Quirino, Abra and Santiago City in Isabela for the information and guidance of all concerned.</p> <p>As prescribed therein, all government and private ports under the jurisdiction of PMO Misamis Oriental/Cagayan de Oro shall adopt the following guidelines, to wit:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Passenger Terminal Buildings (PTBs) shall only operate at 50% capacity. 2. Only individuals cleared to travel under Omnibus Guidelines of IATF-MEID shall be allowed inside PTBs and port facilities, namely, front liners/essential workers, persons traveling for medical or humanitarian reasons, ROFs, APORs and workers of establishments permitted to operate under MECQ. 3. Travel shall remain to be subjected to the requirements as may be imposed by the Local Government Units (LGUs) where voyages originate and end. 4. Minimum public health standards, which include physical distancing, hand hygiene, cough etiquette, and wearing of face masks and face shields, among others, shall continue to be strictly implemented and enforced. <p>In view thereof, concerned PPA personnel, Private Port Operators, ship owners/ship operators, shippers, consignees and other port stakeholders are advised to observe the above-cited guidelines, as appropriate.</p> <p>For guidance and ready reference.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"> PPSUPT BERNARDO A/GARTALIA</p> <p>Encl: A/S</p> <div style="text-align: center;"></div>

SUBJECT : **IMPLEMENTATION OF MODIFIED ENHANCED COMMUNITY QUARANTINE (MECQ) IN NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION (NCR), BULACAN, RIZAL, LAGUNA, CAVITE, QUIRINO, ABRA, AND SANTIAGO CITY IN ISABELA**

In view of the declaration today by the Office of the President of the implementation of MECQ in NCR, Bulacan, Rizal, Laguna, Cavite, Quirino, Abra, and Santiago City in Isabela effective April 12 to 30, 2021, the following guidelines are hereby prescribed for all government and private ports under the jurisdiction of the Philippine Ports Authority (PPA) in aforementioned areas:

1. Passenger Terminal Buildings (PTBs) shall only operate at 50% capacity.
2. Only individuals cleared to travel under Omnibus Guidelines of the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases shall be allowed inside PTBs and port facilities, namely, front liners/essential workers, persons traveling for medical or humanitarian reasons, Returning Overseas Filipinos (ROFs), Authorized Persons Outside of Residence (APORs), and workers of establishments permitted to operate under MECQ.
3. Travel shall remain to be subjected to the requirements as may be imposed by the local government units (LGUs) where voyages originate and end.
4. Minimum public health standards, which include physical distancing, hand hygiene, cough etiquette, and wearing of face masks and face shields, among others, shall continue to be strictly implemented and enforced.

Compliance with this Memorandum is strictly enjoined.
