Transmitted herewith for immediate compliance are the communications from the Department of Transportation (DOTr) dated June 7, 2021 and copy of IATF Resolution No. 101 dated February 26, 2021 on the implementation of Safe, Swift, and Smart Passage (S-PaSS) Travel Management System.

Please ensure all PPA personnel stationed to assist and facilitate boarding and disembarkation of passengers within your area of responsibility are properly oriented in checking the passengers Travel Coordination Permit (TCP) and/ or the Travel Pass-through Permit (TPP), as necessary. Further, each PMO shall designate Shift Managers to direct and advise PTB Operators and Port Service Providers to establish queuing protocols and a help desk to provide assistance to passengers with the S-PaSS registration for efficient management of foot traffic and avoid overcrowding.

In line with the Inter-Agency Task Force on Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF) Resolution No. 101 dated 26 February 2021, all transport sectors are hereby directed to uniformly adopt the use of Safe, Swift, and Smart Passage (S-PASS) Travel Management System as a tool for ensuring compliance of travel requirements of the destined LGUs of passengers. Attached is a copy of the said resolution for reference.

Please ensure all transport terminal personnel stationed to monitor boarding of passengers within your respective sectors to be properly oriented in checking the passengers travel coordination permit (TCP) and/or the travel pass-through permit (TPP), as necessary. Further, all sectoral officials are hereby require its respective transport operators to establish queuing protocols and a help desk to provide assistance to passengers with the S-PASS registration for efficient management of foot traffic and avoid overcrowding.

RESOLUTION NO. 101 Series of 2021 February 26, 2021

WHEREAS, Section 15 Article II of the 1987 Constitution states that the State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them;

WHEREAS, Section 2(b) of Executive Order No. 168 mandates the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases to prevent and/or minimize the entry of suspected or confirmed patients with emerging infectious diseases into the country;

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2020, the President issued Proclamation No. 1021 (s.2020) extending the period of the State of Calamity throughout the Philippines until September 21, 2021;

WHEREAS, the Department of Health received reports regarding a new variant of the SARS-CoV-2 (B.1.1.7 or VUI 2020/12/01) spreading in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (United Kingdom) and another variant identified in South Africa (501.V2);

WHEREAS, Memoranda of the Executive Secretary provided for additional measures to be observed relative to the SARS-COV-2 Variant detected in the United Kingdom including the imposition of travel restrictions on countries/jurisdictions where the new COVID-19 variants were officially reported, and subjected Filipino citizens coming from the same countries/jurisdictions to an absolute 14-day quarantine period notwithstanding a negative Reverse-Transcription - Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) test result;

WHEREAS, the continued implementation of proactive measures is necessary to ensure the utmost protection of the health of the Filipino people.

WHEREAS, as of February 25, 2021, there are a total of Thirty-Two Thousand Four Hundred Thirty-Seven (32,437) active COVID-19 cases in the Philippines;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, that the IATF approves the uniform travel protocols for land, air, and sea of the Department of the Interior and Local Government, crafted in close coordination with the Union of Local Authorities of the



Philippines, League of Provinces of the Philippines, League of Municipalities of the Philippines, and the League of Cities of the Philippines, with the following salient provisions:

- A. On Minimum Public Health Standards:
 - 1. Minimum public health standards, which include physical distancing, hand hygiene, cough etiquette, and wearing of face masks and face shields among others, shall be strictly implemented across all settings; and
 - 2. Clinical and exposure assessment shall be strictly implemented in all ports of entry and exit to ensure that only asymptomatic, non-close contact individuals are allowed to travel or enter the local government unit of destination. Health assessment of passengers, supervised by medical doctors, shall be mandatory upon entry in the port/terminal and exit at point of destination;
- B. On Testing and Quarantine:
 - 1. Testing shall not be mandatory for traveler except if the LGU of destination (province with respect to their municipalities and component cities, and highly urbanized cities [HUCs] and independent component cities [ICCs]) will require testing as a requirement prior to travel, and such shall be limited to RT-PCR; and
 - 2. No traveler shall be required to undergo quarantine unless they exhibit symptoms upon arrival at the LGU of destination;
- C. On Documentary Requirements:
 - 1. Travel Authority issued by Joint Task Force COVID Shield and health certificates shall no longer be required;
 - 2. Authorized Persons Outside of Residence (APORs) from national government agencies and their attached agencies must provide their identification card, travel order, and travel itinerary, and must pass symptom-screening at ports of entry and exit pursuant to IATF Resolution No. 98-A issued on February 4, 2021.
- D. On Information and Communication Technology Solutions:
 - 1. The Safe, Swift, and Smart Passage (S-PaSS) Travel Management System of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) shall be institutionalized as the one-stop-shop application/communication for travelers. For this purpose, a focal person from the province with respect



to their municipalities and component cities, and from HUCs and ICCs shall be assigned; and

- 2. The StaySafe.ph System shall be utilized as the primary contact tracing system. Traze App for airports, and such other existing contact tracing applications must be integrated with the StaySafe.ph System following IATF Resolution No. 85 issued on November 25, 2020.
- E. On Ports/Terminals:
 - 1. All terminals must have assigned sufficient quarantine/isolation facilities;
 - 2. All ports and terminals shall put in place a referral system wherein travelers who become symptomatic shall be transferred to quarantine/isolation facilities to enable the Bureau of Quarantine for airports, or local health officials in case of LGUs, to take over;
 - 3. For the National Capital Region, all buses bound for provinces shall be required to use the Integrated Terminal Exchange as the central hub for transportation. No bus company or public transport shall be allowed use of their private terminals; and
 - 4. At their option, LGUs may provide transportation for all travelers who are transiting from one LGU to another in cases of arrivals at air and seaports to their end-point destinations.

These uniform travel protocols shall be applicable to all LGUs and may be further refined and/or amended jointly by the DILG, DOH, DOT, DOTr, DOST, and the PNP, without further need of an IATF issuance. For this purpose, the aforementioned agencies as well as other identified agencies, and the local government units are enjoined to ensure smooth implementation of these protocols.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Chairperson and the Co-Chairperson shall be duly authorized to sign this Resolution for and on behalf of the Inter-Agency Task Force.

In compliance with Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) for Emerging Infectious Diseases Resolution No. 101 dated February 26, 2021, and in light of the request of the League of Provinces of the Philippines through its President, Governor Presbitero J. Velasco, Jr., contained in his letter dated May 7, 2021 addressed to the Secretary of the Department of Transportation (DOTr), the following are hereby prescribed:

- 1. The S-PaSS Travel Management System of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) shall be strictly adopted as the one-stop-shop application/communication for passengers for implementation in ports under the jurisdiction of the Philippine Ports Authority (PPA).
- 2. Passengers shall be required to register with the S-PaSS, and to show proof of the same upon purchase of tickets, entry in ports, and upon boarding in order to ensure compliance with the travel requirements of the concerned Local Government Units (LGUs).

All Port Managers shall submit to the AGM for Operations through the Port Operations Services Department a report on the actions taken to implement this Memorandum within three (3) days from issuance hereof.
