MV SAMAL EMBARKS ON MAIDEN VOYAGE

The MV Samal marked a significant milestone as it set sail on its maiden voyage from Nansha, China, to the Port of Cagayan de Oro, Philippines, on Sunday, 19 January 2025. The vessel, carrying 291 containers for discharge, arrived at the Pilot Station at 16:00H and was docked and secured by 16:45H. It is scheduled to depart the following day, Monday, 20 January 2025, at 12:00H, with 118 containers to be loaded for its next destination.

Built in 2023, the MV Samal is a modern container vessel sailing under the flag of Antigua and Barbuda. The ship boasts a total length overall of 172.00 meters and a gross tonnage of 18,680, showcasing its capacity to support international trade efficiently.

During its call to the Port of Cagayan de Oro, the Philippine Ports Authority (PPA) PMO MOC, represented by PMO's operations personnel along with the representative from CHO, presented a Certificate of Appreciation to the vessel's master, Grigorii Grabar. This token of gratitude recognized the MV Samal's choice of the port as its first Philippine destination, aligning with the PPA's mission of fostering global-level port services and contributing to regional and national economic growth. The Philippine Ports Authority (PPA) – Port Management Office (PMO) Misamis Oriental/Cagayan de Oro officially launched Passenger Arrival Gate IF in the Port of Cagayan de Oro Passenger Terminal Complex today, 24 February 2025. This new addition to the port's facilities is expected to enhance the passenger arrival experience and streamline the flow of travelers.

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Gate 1F will serve as the designated exit for arriving passengers aboard vessels docked at Berth 1 and a portion of Berth 2. These vessels typically arrive from Cebu and/or Bohol, offering an efficient and organized disembarkation process for those traveling to and from the region.

With the new gate in operation, passengers will benefit from smoother and more accessible exits, ensuring quicker processing times and improved safety measures.

The launch of Gate IF is part of the Sustainable, Efficient, and Admirable (S.E.A) Travel Experience efforts by the PMO to provide better services for travelers.

The Port of Cagayan de Oro is a key gateway for trade and tourism in Northern Mindanao, and this new facility is a significant step in making the port even more accessible to the growing number of passengers and visitors.

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NEW AND REVISED PPA GUIDELINES ON THE WORKS; PPA TWG CONDUCTS CONSULTATION WITH PMO MO/C



PORT OF CAGAYAN DE ORO — To obtain information on actual scenarios and status on the ground and identify issues and operational concerns relative to assessment of free storage period and storage charges of containerized cargoes, titling of port facilities and properties of PPA, Port Zone Delineation (PZD), and Port Reception Facilities (PRF), the PPA Board Technical Working Group (TWG) conducted consultation with the Port Management Office of Misamis Oriental/Cagayan de Oro (PMO MO/C) on 14 February 2025.

This consultation is in line with further enhancing or refining the sets of drafted new and revised PPA guidelines/ regulations which are aimed at optimizing the utilization of port areas, enhancing control mechanisms and overall improve port operations. These include the Proposed 2025 Revised Rules on the Assessment of Free Storage Period and Storage Charges for Containerized Cargoes and Empty Containers in PPA Government Ports; Proposed Guidelines for the Tilting of Port Facilities and Properties of the Philippine Ports Authority (PPA); and Revised Guidelines on the Provision of Port Reception Facilities (PRF).

Present during the consultation were TWG Chairperson Abdulfatak A. Pandapatan and members, PPA Head Office personnel, PMO MO/C key personnel headed by Acting Port Manager Fernando B. Mapalo, Jr., and representatives from Oroport Cargo Handling Services, Inc., the terminal operator of Cagayan de Oro Port.

The TWG and the attendees discussed the challenges being encountered in ports and possible resolutions thereat which may be incorporated in the provisions in the draft Administrative Orders. The TWG provided the PMO with guidance and recommendations on courses of actions to undertake to duly comply with the guidelines within the timelines once the proposed issuances are approved by the PPA Board and implemented.



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PMO MOC CONDUCTS FIRST QUARTER PORT **INSPECTION AT TMO CAMIGUIN**



In line with the Philippine Ports Authority's (PPA) ongoing efforts to maintain high standards of port management and operational excellence, the Acting Port Manager of PPA Misamis Oriental/Cagayan de Oro recently visited the Terminal Management Office (TMO) in Camiguin for a comprehensive inspection on March 14, 2025. 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VACCINATION OF PPD PERSONNEL UNDER THE DOG-FREE ZONE PROGRAM

CAGAYAN DE ORO CITY - The Port Management Office of Misamis Oriental (PMO MOC), in partnership with the City Health Office, successfully administered the first dose of the anti-rabies vaccine to 8 personnel from the Port Police Division on January 21, 2025, at the Animal Bite Treatment Center, City Health Office. The group was vaccinated as part of the PMO MOC's ongoing Dog-Free Zone Program, designed to safeguard employees from rabies exposure and promote occupational safety and health (OSH) within the port area.

The anti-rabies vaccination program is a key component of the PMO's Dog-Free Zone Program, which aims to minimize the presence of stray dogs within the port area. By reducing the risk of animal-borne diseases like rabies, the program creates a safer and healthier environment for PMO MOC personnel and the public.

The PMO MOC remains committed to implementing comprehensive health and safety programs aimed at promoting the well-being of its employees. The successful administration of the anti-rabies vaccine to the Port Police Division personnel is just one step in this ongoing effort, and future vaccination drives are expected to cover other personnel in the port area as needed.





ILLEGAL DRUGS SEIZED IN BALINGOAN PORT DURING ROUTINE SECURITY CHECK





BALINGOAN, MISAMIS ORIENTAL – A 19 year old male individual was apprehended for the possession of illegal drugs during a routine screening at the Port of Balingoan on January 25, 2025. The suspect, a passenger aboard the MV Kalinaw, was scheduled for the 12:30 PM voyage bound for Camiguin Province.

At approximately 12:00 PM, security personnel conducted a routine frisk and found the individual in possession of suspected illegal drugs, identified as shabu. Immediately following the discovery, the suspect was detained and handed over to the authorities for further investigation.

Local authorities, including the Maritime Police, the Philippine Coast Guard, and the Barangay Bauk-Bauk representative, responded quickly to the incident. The individual was subjected to the proper legal procedures, and the case is now under the jurisdiction of the PNP Maritime Police for further disposition. The Port of Balingoan remains committed to maintaining strict security measures to ensure the safety and security of all

passengers. Authorities are continuing to monitor and enhance





their operations to prevent illegal activities at the port.
