PMO MOC conducts Mental Health Seminar

The Philippine Ports Authority – PMO Misamis Oriental/Cagayan de Oro (PMO MOC) conducted a full-day seminar titled "Common Mental Health Conditions in the Workplace," aimed at promoting mental wellness as an essential part of a productive and supportive work environment on June 20, 2025. The session was led by Dr. Frances Mae O. Gumapon-Lua, M.D., DSBPP, a respected psychiatrist and mental health advocate who brought both depth and empathy to the discussion.

Dr. Gumapon-Lua's talk shed light on the mental health challenges often experienced in professional spaces—such as stress, burnout, anxiety, and depression—and how this impact not only individual performance but also team dynamics, workplace relationships, and overall organizational efficiency. Drawing on local data, she emphasized the growing need for mental health support in the Philippine workplace, especially amid a shortage of mental health professionals. Through this seminar, common misconceptions and stigma were addressed, helping employees develop a more informed and compassionate view of their own struggles and those of their colleagues.

What made the session especially impactful was the safe and supportive atmosphere that emerged toward the end. Participants—both regular and contract of service personnel—began to open up, sharing personal thoughts, emotions, and experiences.



Port Inspection and Coordination Visit at the Ports of Jasaan, Balingoan, Medina, Gingoog, Magsaysay and AMADI

The Philippine Ports Authority – Port Management Office of Misamis Oriental/Cagayan de Oro (PPA PMO MO/C), through its Task Force on Private Ports (TFPP), completed the private port inspections under the jurisdiction of PMO MOC from March 25 to 27, 2025, following the initial round held on March 18–19.

The inspections, conducted in 13 private ports under PMO MO/C were assessed for compliance with Statutory requirements for safety, security, environmental, and infrastructure standards set by the PPA.

The Port Management Office of Misamis Oriental/Cagayan de Oro (PMO-MOC) Seinor staff conducted a port inspection and coordination visit on May 23, 2025, covering the Ports of Jasaan, Balingoan, Medina, Gingoog, Magsaysay and Amadi in Lagonglong. The activity aimed to assess current port conditions, validate ongoing and proposed developments, and engage with local stakeholders on matters concerning port operations, infrastructure planning, and development initiatives.

The PMO MOC inspection team met with local government units and stakeholders to gather data, review project progress, and discuss operational concerns. Key areas of focus included infrastructure improvements in Jasaan, passenger facility enhancements in Balingoan, verification of port layout and land use planning in Medina, zoning coordination in Gingoog, and proposed development planning in Magsaysay.

Following the inspection, PMO-MOC's way forward actions includes follow-ups on technical support, documentation, and coordination with relevant agencies.

PPA PMO-MO/C Joins Coastal Clean-Up in Celebration of the Month of the OCean 2025

n celebration of Month of the Ocean 2025, the Philippine Ports Authority – Port Management Office Misamis Oriental/Cagayan de Oro (PPA PMO-MO/C) joined a coastal clean-up spearheaded by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) on May 23, 2025. With the theme "Unlocking Ocean-Based Solutions to Climate Change," the activity aimed to promote ocean conservation and climate awareness. A total of 24 personnel from PPA PMO-MO/C participated, with the office assigned to Bitan-ag Creek (Coastal Road) alongside volunteers from Barangay Lapasan, CLENRO, PCG, and other partner agencies. The activity also forms part of the PMO's compliance with the conditions of its Environmental Compliance Certificate (ECC) and its continued implementation of the Green Port Award System (GPAS), highlighting its commitment to sustainable and environmentally responsible port operations.

Further, volunteers gathered at the San Juan covered court at 5:30 AM for a short program. A representative from Barangay Lapasan welcomed participants and stressed the importance of community action in protecting marine ecosystems. The DENR focal person gave instructions on clean-up procedures and documentation using the Trash Data Form. After a brief group dance to energize the crowd, volunteers proceeded to their assigned areas.













PMO MOC Joins WISE Tier 2 Oil Spill Response Drill





The Port Management Office of Misamis Oriental/Cagayan de Oro (PMO MOC) took part in the WISE Oil Spill Response Exercise Tier 2 2025-01 held today, April 30, 2025, at Berth 10, Cagayan de Oro Port. The drill simulated a Tier-2 Oil Spill Incident from the Tanker M/T TANKEE.

PMO MOC personnel observed in the event, including Chief Safety Officer Ryan P. Nalzaro, the Environmental Specialist, Terminal Supervisor Jonathan T. Saliring, and Station Commander Medardo Sosobrado, alongside staff from OPM, PSD, and PPD divisions. Within 10 minutes of the simulated spill, two tugboats, Limay and Charger, arrived to initiate containment. Using a 750 mm inflatable oil spill boom measuring 250 meters, the tugs established a U-shaped formation to contain the oil slick before transitioning to a J-formation to guide the oil toward the recovery point beside Tugboat Limay.

A spreader arm on Tug Limay simulated dispersant spraying (using seawater), followed by the deployment of a skimmer to recover surface oil, which was then transferred into Intermediate Bulk Container (IBC) tanks. A rubber boat remained on standby for boom adjustments and potential man-overboard incidents. Onshore, recovered oil was handed over to a licensed waste disposal contractor for proper treatment.
